

Introduction

The Israeli bombardment of the Gaza Strip has turned a large part of the besieged Palestinian enclave into a pile of rubble, with people in desperate need of water, fuel and life-saving necessities, amid a total blockade of the enclave. Thousands of buildings, including hospitals, mosques and churches, have also been damaged or destroyed in Israel's relentless air and ground attacks on the besieged enclave.

This report, available in English and Arabic, provides daily facts and statistics about Israeli massacres in the Gaza Strip in the period between January 12 - 14, 2024.

It also sheds light on the political and humanitarian aftermaths along with the human loss and material damage inflicted on the besieged enclave as a result of the unabated strikes and Israeli siege, impeding Gazans' access to humanitarian assistance.

1. Daily Scenes:

Friday - 12 Jan. 2024

As of Friday evening, over 180 Palestinians have been killed in Israeli air and ground attacks on the Gaza Strip. More than 700 others have been left wounded.

The Gaza-based Palestinian Health Ministry said 151 dead bodies and 248 injured people have been transferred to hospitals following 13 massacres committed by Israeli forces against civilians across the besieged enclave.

On the 98th day of the genocide, the death toll since Oct. 7 has climbed to 23,708 and the injured to 60,005.

Israeli forces fatally shot three Palestinians in the southern occupied West Bank city of Al-Khalil and beat another young man to death in Tulkarem, bringing the West Bank's death toll since Oct. 7 to 347.



Saturday - 13 Jan. 2024

The Gaza Health Ministry said 135 dead bodies and 312 injured people have been received at the enclave's hospitals as of Saturday morning as a result of 12 massacres committed by the Israeli military in less than 24 hours.

Deadly Israeli air strikes continued, with dozens reportedly killed in Rafah and Khan Younis.

The Israeli army bombed houses in the Al-Sawarha area, in the west of Nuseirat refugee camp, leaving multiple people dead and others wounded.

Israeli forces have surrounded the Al-Amal Hospital in the occupied West Bank city of Jenin during a raid that began this evening. Soldiers can be seen intercepting and searching ambulances as the sound of clashes can be heard. An Israeli army bulldozer excavated the road in front of the hospital, called Haifa Street, and committed other acts of vandalism in the surrounding area.



Israeli security forces have raided a Palestinian house in Al-Khalil, in the southern occupied West Bank, where a family has been mourning three Palestinians who were shot and killed near the Israeli settlement of Adora. Ismail Ahmed Youssef Abu Jahisha, 19; Mahmoud Arafat Youssef Abu Jahisha, 16; and Uday Isma'in Yousef Abu Jahisha, also 16, were all cousins from the town of Idhna. The soldiers fired tear gas, live and rubber-coated bullets and sound bombs at the house.

Sunday - 14 Jan. 2024

As of noontime on Sunday, 125 victims and 265 injured have been received at Gaza hospitals, following 11 massacres perpetrated by the Israeli army since the crack of dawn. The death toll has now reached 23,968 and the injured 60,582.

Israeli warplanes struck the vicinities of the Khansaa school-turned-shelter, in Absan Al-Kabira, east of Khan Younis, in the southern Gaza Strip. Makeshift tents set up for the displaced in the neighbourhoods of Al-Rimel, Askoula, Al-Zaytoun, Al-Shujai'ya, Al-Daraj and Al-Tuffah, have been flooded with rainwater and sewage wastewater.

The NetBlocks observatory says the more than 48-hour communications outage has left "most residents cut off" as the war in the enclave passes the 100-day mark. Operator Paltel has said that two of its repair crews have been killed while trying to restore service.

Five Palestinians have been shot dead by the Israeli army in the occupied West Bank, including three children. Sixteen-year-old Khaled Hmeidat and 17-year-old Suleiman Kanaan were killed by Israeli forces in El-Bireh.



Sixteen-year-old Louay Al-Sufi was killed by Israeli forces during a raid on the Ain Sultan refugee camp, north of the city of Jericho. Two Palestinians were killed by Israeli forces in Sair, north of Al-Khalil while in a car the military said broke through a checkpoint.

At least seven Palestinians have been injured during an Israeli raid on the Al-Faraa refugee camp south of Tubas. Israeli soldiers obstructed the work of medical teams and stopped and searched at least one ambulance.

2. Political and Humanitarian Repercussions

By the latest Health Ministry-provided count, at least 23,843 people have been killed and more than 60,317 wounded in Israeli attacks on Gaza since October 7.

"How did these 100 days pass? I do not know how they passed. But they passed with bitterness, with martyrs, wounded. They've passed with scenes of pain, cruelty and sorrow," Suhaib al-Hamms, a doctor at the Kuwaiti Hospital in Rafah, told reporters.

"We witnessed destruction, not only of homes, of universities and schools. And what was bombed was not just hospitals or streets, the targets not only medical teams or ambulances," he continued. "It's our dreams, our aspirations, our hopes for a dignified life that we had tried to live under siege. They also went with them".

Philippe Lazzarini, head of the UN agency for Palestinian refugees (UNRWA), said in a statement: "The massive death, destruction, displacement, hunger, loss and grief of the last 100 days are staining our shared humanity. It's been 100 days since the devastating war started, killing and displacing people in Gaza".

The Palestine Red Crescent Society (PRCS) has said that 180 women are giving birth in Gaza under "dangerous and inhumane conditions" every day. Many of them are unable to reach hospitals due to being in besieged areas, with the Israeli forces preventing ambulances from reaching them. In a video posted by the group, a doctor attempts to assist a woman through birth by giving her instructions over the phone. WHO chief Tedros decried "over 300 attacks on health and continuous lack of safe access to critical aid" in the enclave. He noted that only 15 hospitals remain operational but are only able to provide limited services.

"People in Gaza are living in hell. Nowhere is safe. 100 days, and counting, of incessant insecurity and fear is beyond words," he wrote on X. "Everything must be done to end the violence to prevent more needless death and injury".

International Federation of the Red Cross Secretary-General Jagan Chapagain has made the latest appeal for humanitarian reprieve for the people of Gaza, saying on X: "In Gaza, the health care system is on the brink of collapse. In any conflict or crisis, access to health care is a question of life or death".

The United Nations has said Israeli denials of access for humanitarian missions have increased since the beginning of the year. Only about 21 percent of planned humanitarian deliveries to northern Gaza have reached their destinations in the first weeks of the year. US Senator Bernie Sanders has voiced some of his harshest criticism yet of Israel's war on Gaza after facing earlier backlash from progressives for refusing to voice support for a ceasefire: "I hope that he [Biden] understands that you can be

pro-Israel without supporting Netanyahu and the horrific war he is waging against the Palestinian people," Sanders told The Guardian.

Earlier this week, Sanders also called for greater scrutiny on US arms sales to Israel, saying the US is "deeply complicit in what is going on, and we have to ensure the US aid is being used in line with international human rights and our own laws".

3. Humanitarian Loss and Material Damage


As escalating violence in Gaza continues for a fourth month, Gaza has descended into one of the world's most severe humanitarian and health crises. Over 23,968 people have died, of which 70% have been women (nearly 7,200) and children (nearly 10,600). Over 60,582 people have sustained injuries and nearly 7,000 have been missing under rubble piles. Israeli army committed more than 2,000 massacres across the Gaza Strip. The list of victims includes 337 medics and paramedics, 45 civil defense members, and 117 journalists.



Nearly 2 million people have become internally displaced .lsraeli forces have detained 99 medics and paramedics along with ten journalists and 661 civilians since the outbreak of the war.

More than 30 hospitals and 53 health centers on the Strip have been out of service. Over 150 healthcare facilities have been targeted by Israeli military. Israeli forces also targeted and destroyed 121 ambulances.

Infectious diseases are rife and spreading fast in overcrowded shelters. Hundreds of people with war injuries are unable to receive care. 400,000 cases of infectious diseases and more than 8,000 cases of Hepatitis A have been detected as a result of Israel's forced displacement.



Some 60,000 pregnant women in Gaza face critical risks due to the inability to provide health care, while 350,000 individuals with chronic illnesses are facing critical risks due to the lack of medication.

The UN said only one-fifth of the 5,000 beds needed to meet trauma and emergency needs are available in Gaza, as Israel's assault continues to take a devastating toll on the Strip's overstretched health system.

Israeli air and ground onslaughts totally destroyed 140 government facilities along with 99 schools and universities while partially damaging 295 schools and universities. 142 mosques and three churches were razed to the ground while 250 others

sustained massive damage. Nearly 70,000 housing units have been completely razed to the ground; 295,000 units have been partially damaged and made uninhabitable. Israeli attacks destroyed 200 historical sites.

At least 352 Palestinians have been killed in Israeli military raids across the West Bank since Oct. 7. Up to 4,000 people have been wounded and 5,835 arrested. Israeli army incursions have led to the displacement of 2,599 Palestinians from their homes and the demolition of 421 structures.
