

Introduction

This report documents the genocide committed by the Israeli occupation in the Gaza Strip, covering daily scenes from April 4 to April 13, 2024. It also covers the political and humanitarian repercussions, and the material and human loss suffered by Gaza due to ongoing aggression and siege, compounded by severe restrictions on aid. Additionally, it addresses the ramifications of aggression in the West Bank, where citizens have faced assassinations and arrests by Israeli occupation forces since October 7, 2023.



1. Daily Scenes:

Thursday, April 4, 2024

On Thursday, April 4, 2024, the Israeli occupation army continued its massacres across the Gaza Strip, resulting in 65 deaths and about 100 injuries by the evening. The Ministry of Health in Gaza reported 62 deaths and 91 injuries from six massacres by the Israeli occupation forces as of Thursday morning. This brings the total number of victims to 33,037 deaths and 75,668 injuries from October 7, 2023, to April 4, 2024.



On the 181st day of the genocide by the occupation army, daily scenes disproved the occupation's claims of safe areas in the Gaza Strip, as bombardments by ground, air, and sea hit multiple locations including Khan Yunis and Abasan in the south, as well as Al-Zawaida, Al-Mughraqa, Al-Maghazi camp, and Deir al-Balah in the central Gaza Strip. The occupation forces continued to target the health system and displaced individuals, with documented artillery shelling near Nasser Hospital and Al-Amal Hospital in Khan Yunis, causing injuries. Additionally, an airstrike targeted a house sheltering displaced people in Rafah's Tal al-Sultan neighborhood.

Meanwhile, the occupation army persisted in its systematic destruction of infrastructure and civilian facilities in the Gaza Strip, with documented demolitions of homes and residential areas in the Al-Amal neighborhood, and the Abasan and Bani Suheila areas, west and east of Khan Yunis Governorate.

In the West Bank, the occupation army continued its policy of systematic killing, including the assassination of a citizen in Ya'bad town, where occupation soldiers and Musta'ribeen units surrounded his house, executed him, and blocked ambulance crews from providing health care for him. This brought the total number of victims in the West Bank to 458 deaths and 4,750 injuries from October 7, 2023, to April 4, 2024.





Friday, April 5, 2024

On Friday, April 5, 2024, the Israeli occupation army continued its massacres throughout the Gaza Strip, with multiple incidents resulting in the deaths of 62 individuals and injuries to 91 others by the evening, amid the ongoing genocide. The Ministry of Health in Gaza reported 54 deaths and 82 injuries as of Friday morning from five massacres targeting civilians. This brought the total number of victims to 33,091 deaths and 75,750 injuries from October 7, 2023, to April 5, 2024.

On the 182nd day of the genocide, daily scenes exposed the falsity of the occupation's claims of safe areas in the Gaza Strip.

Bombardments by ground, air, and sea targeted various locations, including Rafah, Khan Yunis, Batn as-Sameen, and Abasan.

In the south, areas such as Al-Nuseirat, Al-Maghazi, Al-Zawaida, and Deir al-Balah in the central Gaza Strip, along with Beit Hanoun and Sheikh Zayed City in the north, were targeted by bombardments on Friday, April 5, 2024. This further underscored the occupation's false claims of safe zones in Gaza.

The genocide perpetrated by the occupation army in Gaza extended to targeting civilian and residential structures. Documentation revealed the destruction of homes in Khan Yunis and residential towers in Al-Nuseirat, resulting in civilian injuries. Tragically, some individuals were found deceased beneath the rubble, inaccessible to ambulance and civil defense crews due to the relentless targeting. In the West Bank, the occupation army continued its systematic killing, as evidenced by the assassination of a refugee from Nur Shams camp in Tulkarm. Sniper bullets fired by occupation soldiers surrounding the victim's location resulted in the casualty. This grim incident increased the total number of victims in the West Bank to 459 deaths and 4,750 injuries from October 7, 2023, to April 5, 2024.







Saturday, April 6, 2024

On Saturday, April 6, 2024, the Israeli occupation army persisted in committing massacres across the Gaza Strip, with multiple incidents resulting in numerous casualties by the evening, amid the ongoing genocide. The Ministry of Health in Gaza reported 46 deaths and 65 injuries as of Saturday morning from four massacres targeting civilians, bringing the total number of victims to 33,137 deaths and 75,815 wounded from October 7, 2023, to April 6, 2024.

On the 183rd day of the genocide, daily scenes once again exposed the falsehood of the occupation's claims of safe areas in the Gaza Strip. Ground, air, and sea bombardments hit various areas including the Kuwait Roundabout area in Gaza City, Rafah, Khan Yunis, Al-Fukhari, Al-Mughraqa, Al-Nuseirat camp, Deir al-Balah in the middle of the Gaza Strip, and Jabalia in the north, subjecting civilians to further danger.

In addition to targeting civilian and residential structures, the occupation army continued its destruction, documenting the demolition of a residential area east of the Nasser Medical Complex in Khan Yunis. Artillery shelling also struck residential areas east of Gaza City, exacerbating the humanitarian crisis.



Sunday, April 7, 2024

On Sunday, April 7, 2024, the Israeli occupation army continued its massacres across the Gaza Strip, with multiple incidents resulting in the deaths of 45 individuals and injuries to about 90 citizens by the evening, amidst the ongoing genocide. The Ministry of Health

in Gaza reported 38 deaths and 71 injuries as of Sunday morning from four massacres targeting civilians. This brought the total number of victims to 33,175 deaths and 75,886 wounded from October 7, 2023, to April 7, 2024.

On the 184th day of the genocide perpetrated by the occupation army, daily scenes starkly contradicted the occupation's claims of safe areas in the Gaza Strip.

Bombardments from land, air, and sea targeted various locations, including the Al-Shuja'iya neighborhood and



Al-Rashid Street in Gaza City, Rafah, Khan Yunis, the vicinity of Al-Aqsa University in the south, and the town of Al-Mughraqa in the central area of the Gaza Strip.

As part of the ongoing genocide in the Gaza Strip, the occupation army continued to target displaced individuals. Six fatalities were documented, with several others injured in an aerial drone strike targeting a store housing displaced people in the Ain Jalut Towers, south of the Al-Nuseirat camp in the central part of the Gaza Strip.

Monday, April 8, 2024

Monday, April 8, 2024, saw the Israeli occupation army continue its massacres throughout the Gaza Strip, with multiple incidents resulting in the deaths of 35 individuals and injuries to about 55 citizens by the evening, amidst the ongoing genocide. The Ministry of Health in Gaza reported 32 deaths and 47 injuries as of Monday morning from several massacres targeting civilians. This brought the total number of victims to 33,207 deaths and 75,933 wounded from October 7, 2023, to April 8, 2024.







On the 185th day of the genocide carried out by the occupation army, daily scenes once again exposed the falsehood of the occupation's claims of safe areas in the Gaza Strip. Ground, air, and sea bombardments hit various areas including the Tel al-Hawa neighborhood in Gaza City, Khan Yunis, Rafah, agricultural lands along the Egyptian border in the south, and Deir al-Balah, Al-Nuseirat, and al-Maghazi camps in the central Gaza Strip.

On Monday, April 8, 2024, the documentation also revealed the recovery of bodies of tens of deaths who were buried under the rubble. In Khan Yunis, 38 bodies were recovered, highlighting the devastating toll of the ongoing violence. Additionally, an unspecified number of bodies were retrieved from the Al-Shifa Medical Complex in Gaza City, which endured a massive attack lasting two weeks. As part of the occupation army's genocide in Gaza, the targeting of the health system persisted. Air strikes were documented in the vicinity of Al-Kuwaiti Hospital in Rafah, further straining medical resources in the already besieged region. In the West Bank, the occupation army continued its relentless policy of systematic killing. The assassination of a girl from the village of Tayasir was documented, shot by occupation forces near a military checkpoint in Tubas city. This tragic incident raised the total number of victims in the West Bank to 460 deaths and 4,750 wounded from October 7, 2023, to April 8, 2024.

Tuesday, April 9, 2024

Tuesday, April 9, 2024, saw the Israeli occupation army persisting in committing massacres throughout the Gaza Strip. Multiple incidents were documented, resulting in the deaths of approximately 170 individuals and injuring about 60 citizens by the evening, amidst the ongoing genocide perpetrated by the Israeli occupation in Gaza.

The Ministry of Health in Gaza reported 153 fatalities and 60 injuries as of Tuesday morning, stemming from several massacres targeting civilians. This brought the total number of victims to 33,360 deaths and 75,993 wounded from October 7, 2023, until April 9, 2024, marking the 186th day of the genocide carried out by the occupation army.



Daily scenes highlighted the falsehood of the occupation's claims regarding the existence of safe areas in the Gaza Strip. Ground, air, and sea bombardments hit various areas, including Gaza City, Al-Qarara, Rafah, and Khan Yunis in the south, as well as Deir al-Balah, Madinat al-Zahra, Al-Maghazi camp, and Al-Nuseirat camp in the central Gaza Strip. In the northern Gaza Strip, the targeting of Al-Sika Street in Jabalia Camp was documented.

Tuesday, April 9, 2024, also witnessed the recovery of dozens of bodies who were buried under the rubble, with 84 bodies recovered in Khan Yunis after the occupation forces withdrew from some areas.

As part of the genocide perpetrated by the occupation army in the Gaza Strip, the targeting of displaced individuals and humanitarian aid continued. Artillery shelling targeted the vicinity of a school housing displaced people in the city of Deir al-Balah, resulting in two fatalities. Additionally, a bombing targeted committees working to secure aid southeast of Gaza City, resulting in one fatality and another citizen being injured.

Wednesday, April 10, 2024

Wednesday, April 10, 2024, marked another day of tragedy as the Israeli occupation army persisted in committing massacres throughout the Gaza Strip. Multiple incidents were documented, resulting in the deaths of approximately 153 deaths and injuring about 60 citizens by the evening, highlighting the ongoing genocide perpetrated by the Israeli occupation in Gaza.

The Ministry of Health in Gaza reported 122 fatalities and 56 injuries as of Wednesday morning, stemming from massacres committed by the occupation army against civilians in the Strip. This brought the total number of victims to 33,482 deaths and 76,049 wounded from October 7, 2023, until April 10, 2024, marking the 187th day of the genocide carried out by the occupation army.

Daily scenes once again exposed the falsehood of the occupation's claims regarding the existence of safe areas in the



Gaza Strip. Ground, air, and sea bombardments targeted various areas, including the Al-Zaytoun neighborhood in Gaza City, Al-Nuseirat Camp, and Madinat Al-Zahraa in the central Gaza Strip, Rafah, and Khan Yunis in the south, and Jabalia Camp in the north. On the same day, Wednesday, April 10, 2024, the occupation forces carried out airstrikes on the Maaz Bin Jabal and Dhu al-Nourin mosques in the new camp in Al-Nuseirat. Additionally, they bombed two preparatory boys' schools in Al-Nuseirat affiliated with the UNRWA relief agency and the Malaysian school, resulting in killing of three displaced individuals. Civilian vehicles and Firas Market in Gaza City were also targeted. The vicinity of the "Shuhada' Al-Maghazi" school in the center of the Gaza Strip was documented as another target of the attacks.

Thursday, April 11, 2024



Thursday, April 11, 2024, saw the Israeli occupation army persisting in committing massacres throughout the Gaza Strip, with multiple incidents documented resulting in the deaths of approximately 89 deaths and injuring about 120 citizens by the evening, underlining the continued genocide perpetrated by the Israeli occupation in Gaza. The Ministry of Health in Gaza reported 63 fatalities and 45 injuries as of Wednesday morning, stemming from massacres committed by the occupation army against civilians in the Strip. This brought the total

number of victims to 33,545 deaths and 76,094 wounded from October 7, 2023, until April 11, 2024, marking the 188th day of the genocide carried out by the occupation army.

Daily scenes once again exposed the falsehood of the occupation's claims regarding the existence of safe areas in the Gaza Strip. Ground, air, and sea bombardments targeted various areas, including the Tel al-Hawa neighborhood and the Beach camp in Gaza City, Al-Nuseirat camp and Madinat al-Zahra in the central Gaza Strip, Khan Yunis, and Rafah in the south of the Gaza Strip, and Jabalia in the north.

Continuing the trend of targeting civilian and residential facilities, as well as places of worship, the destruction of the Maaz Bin Jabal and Dhu al-Nourin mosques was documented. Additionally, the destruction of a school and residential towers in the central Gaza Strip was recorded. These attacks resulted in casualties among the displaced, although the specific source of these casualties was not identified.

Friday, April 12, 2024

Friday, April 12, 2024, witnessed the Israeli occupation army persisting in committing massacres throughout the Gaza Strip, with eight massacres documented, resulting in dozens of deaths and wounded by Friday evening, highlighting the ongoing genocide committed by the Israeli occupation in Gaza.

The Ministry of Health in Gaza reported 89 fatalities and 120 injuries in the Gaza Strip as of Friday morning, stemming from massacres committed by the occupation army against civilians. This brought the total number of victims to 33,634 deaths and 76,214 wounded from October 7, 2023, until April 12, 2024, marking the 189th day of the genocide carried out by the occupation



Daily scenes once again contradicted the occupation's claims regarding the existence of safe areas in the Gaza Strip. Ground, air, and sea bombardments targeted various areas, including the Al-Daraj Quarter, Al-Zaytoun, Al-Shuja'iya, and Al-Rimal neighborhoods in Gaza City, Deir al-Balah, Al-Nuseirat and Al-Maghazi camps in the center of the Strip, and Beit Hanoun in the north. Additionally, a drone bombing targeted a group of citizens in Rafah, south of the Gaza Strip.

As part of the genocide committed by the occupation army in Gaza, places where displaced individuals sought refuge continued to be targeted. The bombing of the "New Camp Joint Primary School" in Al-Nuseirat resulted in casualties, with the majority being women and children.

Similarly, one death and other injuries citizens were documented as a result of occupation boats bombing the primary school opposite the Orouba School in the new camp in



In the West Bank, the occupation army continued its policy of systematic killing, with the documentation of the assassination of three citizens. Two of them were in the El-Far'a camp in the northern West Bank, and another from the village of Al-Mughayyir in the Ramallah and Al-Bireh Governorate, who was killed by settlers' bullets. This raised the total number of victims in the West Bank to 463 deaths and 4,750 wounded from October 7, 2023, until April 12, 2024.

Saturday, April 13, 2024

Al-Nuseirat in the central Gaza Strip.

Saturday, April 13, 2024, marked another tragic day as the Israeli occupation army continued to commit massacres throughout the Gaza Strip. Several massacres were documented, resulting in 52 deaths and dozens of wounded by Saturday evening, underscoring the ongoing genocide perpetrated by the Israeli occupation in Gaza.

Situation Report (No. 34) from April 4 to April 13, 2024



The Ministry of Health in Gaza reported 52 fatalities and 95 injuries in the Gaza Strip as of Saturday morning, stemming from five massacres on army against civilians. This brought the

33,686 deaths and 76,309 wounded from

October 7, 2023, until April 13, 2024, marking the 190th day of the genocide carried out by the occupation army.

Daily scenes once again refuted the occupation's claims regarding the existence of safe areas in the Gaza Strip. Ground, air, and sea bombardments targeted various areas, including Al-Shati Camp, the Al-

Tuffah, Al-Zaytoun, and Al-Shuja'iya neighborhoods in Gaza City, Madinat Al-Zahra, Al-Asra, and Deir al-Balah in the middle of the Strip, Rafah and Khan Yunis in the south, and Sheikh Zayed City in the north.

As part of the genocide committed by the occupation army in the Gaza Strip, places where displaced individuals sought refuge continued to be targeted. A UNRWA school in the new Al-Nuseirat camp in the middle of the Strip, which housed many displaced people, was documented as one such target.

2. Political and Humanitarian Repercussions:

Throughout the period covered by this report, documentation revealed the continued obstruction by occupation authorities of the entry of essential humanitarian supplies into the Gaza Strip. Moreover, they persistently targeted distribution operations and restricted access to the Gaza and North governorates. This has exacerbated and deepened widespread famine, particularly affecting these two governorates, which collectively house at least 300 thousand citizens.

Additionally, investigations have unveiled a grim reality: more than 13,000 Palestinian citizens are missing, presumed to be either buried under rubble, among the deaths in unmarked mass graves or subjected to enforced disappearance in prisons and detention centers operated by the occupation authorities. Shockingly, some have been assassinated within these facilities. The Israeli army has withheld any information regarding the circumstances surrounding these prisoner assassinations.

Human Loss and Material Damage:

In the Gaza Strip, the toll of human suffering has been staggering. From October 7, 2023, to April 13, 2024, the number of deaths rose to 33,686, a devastating count that includes 14,560 children, with 30 children falling victim to famine. Women, too, have borne a heavy burden, with 9,852 among the deaths. Tragically, 485 medical personnel, 66 civil defense workers, and 144 journalists also

lost their lives. The wounded numbered 76,309, while 7,000 individuals remain missing, with children and women constituting 70% of the missing. Displacement has reached an alarming scale, with 2 million people forced from their homes. Shockingly, the occupation army has



been responsible for over 2,973 documented massacres.

In terms of detainment, the period covered by this report saw 310 medical personnel and 20 journalists - whose identities are known - arrested since the ground invasion of the Gaza Strip began on October 27, 2023, bringing the total number of arrests to over 5,000 as of April 13, 2024.

The destruction inflicted upon infrastructure has been catastrophic. The occupation army demolished 171 government buildings, rendered 100 schools and universities completely inoperable, and partially damaged 305 educational institutions. Additionally, 233 mosques were completely demolished, 301 mosques were partially demolished, and three churches were destroyed. Residential units have suffered immensely, with 70,000 homes completely demolished and 290,000 partially destroyed. Furthermore, 200 archaeological and heritage sites fell victim to the onslaught, with over 70,000 tons of explosives ravaging the Strip.

Hospitals and health centers, essential for the well-being of civilians, have been relentlessly targeted. Thirty-two hospitals were put out of service, along with 53 health centers. One hundred fifty-nine health facilities faced attacks that impeded healthcare provision, and 126 ambulances were completely damaged.

The consequences of aid obstruction and the targeting of healthcare facilities are dire. Palestinian citizens face deteriorating health conditions, with 700,000 cases of infectious diseases documented, along with 8,000 cases of viral hepatitis, 10,000 untreated cases of

cancer, 60,000 pregnant women lacking healthcare, and 350,000 individuals suffering from chronic diseases.

In the West Bank, the toll is equally harrowing. The number of deaths reached 466, with over 4,750 wounded and 8,088 individuals held captive. Forced displacement continues unabated, with approximately 3,985 displaced individuals and 648 facilities demolished. These figures underscore the grim consequences of the genocide perpetrated by the Israeli occupation in the Gaza Strip from October 7, 2023, to April 13, 2024.
