

Introduction

The Israeli bombardment of the Gaza Strip has turned a large part of the besieged Palestinian enclave into a pile of rubble, with people in desperate need of water, fuel and life-saving necessities, amid a total blockade of the enclave.

This report, available in English and Arabic, provides daily facts and statistics about Israeli massacres in the Gaza Strip in the period between December 01-03, 2023.

It also sheds light on the political and humanitarian aftermaths along with the human loss and material damage inflicted on the besieged enclave as a result of the unabated strikes and Israeli siege, impeding Gazans' access to humanitarian assistance.

1. Daily Scenes

Friday

1 December 2023

More than 180 Palestinians have been killed and over 589 others wounded as the Israeli military resumed their air and ground attacks on the Gaza Strip, following a weeklong humanitarian pause.

Since the early morning hours, civilian houses in the eastern areas of Khan Younis, in southern Gaza, have come under intense bombardment, with columns of smoke rising into the sky.



Civilians took to the streets with belongings heaped in carts, searching for safe shelter further west after the Israeli military dropped leaflets over Gaza City and southern parts of the enclave on Friday, urging civilians to flee to avoid the fighting; But rights groups have repeatedly warned there are no safe places in Gaza.

Five people have been killed after the Israeli army targeted a family in Salah Aldeen Street, in AlZaytoun neighborhood, as they tried to move southwards in search for safety.

The death toll of Palestinians killed since Oct. 7 has reached over 15,000, including more than 6,150 children and 4,000 women. The number of injured has hit 37,000. More than 6,000 people remain trapped under rubble, most of them presumed dead.



Sirens blared across southern Israel as Hamas fired rockets from the coastal enclave. Hamas said it had targeted Tel Aviv, but there were no reports of casualties or damage there.

Tensions have been running high in the occupied West Bank as Israeli forces intensified their incursions into Palestinian towns and crackdowns on the residents. Escorted Israeli settlers have escalated their attacks on Palestinian property and vehicles. Extremist settlers have forced families in Wadi Qalat, west of Jericho city, out of their lands.

Saturday 2 December 2023



Israel's military continues to turn deaf ears to international appeals to spare civilians and launched hundreds of rockets on residential neighborhoods, killing more than 500 people and wounding hundreds of others .

Israeli forces tightened military grip on Khan Younis, south of the Gaza Strip, and intensified air and ground attacks on the area.

An Israeli genocide in Al-Shuja'iya neighborhood, east of Gaza, claimed the lives of dozens of civilians and destroyed over 50 houses. Jabalia city and its refugee camp along with the adjacent Hamad city have come under intense shelling.

On Saturday evening, sustained Israeli airstrikes on the Al-Falouja area of Jabalia in Northern Gaza killed one of the world's leading scientists, Dr. Sufyan Tayeh alongside his family and scores of others, as announced by the Palestinian Ministry of Higher Education.

The death toll has hit 15,207, nearly 70% among whom women and children. 40,650 have been left wounded while the condition and whereabouts of 7,500 others remain unknown.

Three Palestinians were shot dead by Israeli soldiers and settlers during West Bank raids. A boy was assassinated by an extremist Israeli settler in Bani Hassen village, west of Salfit. Israeli soldiers fatally gunned down a child during an incursion into the Jenin refugee camp.

Sunday 3 December 2023



The Israeli military escalated its air and ground bombardment of the Gaza Strip, targeting Khan Younis and other areas with hundreds of mortar barrages.

At least 500 people have been pronounced dead and hundreds injured.

At least four people were killed and nine others wounded in an Israeli strike late Sunday that targeted the entrance to Kamal Adwan Hospital, in the northern Gaza Strip. Over 10,000 displaced people are seeking shelter at the hospital.

The ongoing intensive Israeli strikes left people unable to bury bodies that were left on the ground in front of and inside the hospital. More than 35 corpses needed to be buried. At least 99 bodies have been brought to Kamal Adwan Hospital since Sunday morning.

The Israeli military committed horrendous massacres against civilians in Al-Shujai'iya neighborhood east of Gaza city, Deir Al-Balah and Al-Nuseirat refugee camp in central Gaza Strip, and Jabalia refugee camp, to the north. Over 100 people have been pronounced dead in Al-Jenneyeh neighborhood, east of Rafah city.

Israeli occupation forces shot and killed a Palestinian teen during a raid in Qalqilya city, in the West Bank.

2. Political & Humanitarian Repercussions

Israel has stepped up its attacks on densely populated neighborhoods in the Gaza Strip, leaving many killed and wounded. The Israeli army resumed bombing the Gaza Strip early Friday after declaring an end to a week-long humanitarian pause.



Civilians are being ordered to move south, but nowhere in Gaza is safe due to the indiscriminate bombing and continued fighting.

The UN has warned that the fighting would worsen an extreme humanitarian emergency. "Hell on Earth has returned to Gaza," Jens Laerke, spokesperson for the UN humanitarian office in Geneva, said.

The Palestinian Red Crescent (PRCS) says Israeli forces informed "all organizations and entities" operating at the crossing that the entry of trucks is prohibited, starting from Friday and until further notice.

"This decision exacerbates the suffering of citizens and increases the challenges facing humanitarian and relief organisations in alleviating the hardships of citizens and displaced persons due to the ongoing aggression," the PRCS said in a post on X.

Speaking to reporters after Israel resumed its bombardment, Gaza's government media office called on Arab and Muslim states to urgently establish field hospitals in the besieged enclave to save "tens of thousands of injured people" and to find "quick humanitarian solutions that address the fate of more than 250,000 families who have lost their homes".

The office's spokesperson, Salama Marouf, said a "large number of aid trucks" is also urgently needed, including at least one million litres (more than 264,000 gallons) of fuel per day.

The pause, which began on November 24, had been extended twice, and Israel had said it could continue as long as Hamas released 10 hostages each day. But after seven days during which women, children and foreign hostages were freed, mediators failed at the final hour to find a formula to release more, including Israeli soldiers and civilian men.

The de-facto humanitarian situation on the ground is catastrophic as most hospitals have gone out of service due to Israeli blockade denying access to food, medicine, and humanitarian aid.

Up to 1.8 million Gazans – around 80 percent of the population – have been forced to leave their homes since Israel began its bombardment on Oct. 7. These people have been overcrowded in hospitals, schools-turned-shelters, shared rooms, makeshift tents, and substandard facilities, with no access to food or water.


Refugee experts have warned the current war was unprecedented for the number of people displaced within the enclave's 140 square miles. With Israel barring most Gazans from leaving and shelters swelling to many times over their capacity, humanitarian aid workers say there is no safe place to go as the fighting continues.

3. Humanitarian Loss and Material Damage

More than 15,523 Palestinians have been killed in Gaza since October 7, including more than 6,600 children and 4,300 women. 41,316 have sustained wounds, with hundreds in critical condition and without life-saving treatment.

Israeli offensives claimed the lives of 280 medics and paramedics, 26 civil defense personnel, and 77 journalists.

Another 7,500 people have gone missing under rubble, most of them presumed dead.



250,000 housing units have sustained partial damage; 50,000 units have been completely destroyed.

Israeli attacks destroyed 103 government offices, 270 schools, 183 mosques, and three churches.

20 hospitals and 110 health centres along with 56 ambulances have been out of service.

259 Palestinians have been killed and 3,480 injured by the Israeli occupation forces in the West Bank since Oct. 7. Thousands have been subjected to arbitrary detention.

1,320 Palestinians have been forced out of their homes.

Israeli forces demolished 180 Palestinian houses and structures since Oct. 7.
